Since 1972, Cameray Child & Family Services has been offering a full spectrum of counselling, education, advocacy, and outreach services to children and families in Burnaby and New Westminster. We are committed to providing specialized services that empower children, youth, and families in an inclusive, accessible, and safe environment.

What We Help With

At Cameray, we provide many types of counselling programs and support for families and children in Burnaby and New Westminster. A complete description of all of our programs, referral requirements, and availability is listed on our website.



COUNSELLING:

We offer many types of counselling programs to children, youth, and their families based on their needs: Family Program, Trauma Program, Sexual Abuse Intervention Program (SAIP), Sexual Health Intervention Program (SHIP), Child and Youth Mental Health (C&Y), and the High Risk Youth Program.

CHILD & YOUTH VICTIM SUPPORT SERVICES (CVSS):

This program provides support and court preparation for children and youth who have witnessed or been the victim of a crime. Referrals can come from any source.

EARLY YEARS PARENTING SUPPORT PROGRAM (EYPSP):

This program offers prevention and early intervention services for parents to strengthen family resiliency. Services include individual parent support sessions and interactive / psycho-educational groups for expectant parents, parents, and caregivers with children aged 0–5.

EMERGENCY SEXUAL ASSAULT SERVICES (ESAS):

This program provides support, counselling, and court preparation for survivors of sexual assault. Referrals may come from any source and there are no age restrictions.

Assisting the Community with Transitioning Students Program (ACTS):

The A.C.T.S. program mentors, guides, and builds life skills in children in grades 5-7 to assist them with the transition to high school. The program is held in a variety of schools.
