CVSS Program Focus:

Cameray's Child Victim Support Service provides support to children and youth (under the age of 19) who are victims or witnesses of crime, along with their non-offending family members.

Referrals must meet the following criteria: clients must either reside in Burnaby or New Westminster, and/or have court proceedings that take place in New Westminster or Vancouver (for Burnaby cases).

Program involvement is voluntary and can begin at any stage of the legal process.

What We Do:

Support can be provided over the phone and/or in person, depending on your needs. For children and youth who are subpoenaed to testify in court, several court preparation sessions can be arranged with the Victim Support Worker prior to attending court.

Services Include:

- Offer emotional support during the police investigation(s) and court proceedings
- Provide resources and referrals to various community agencies
- Assist with safety planning



- Help explain the criminal justice process and roles within
- Provide updates on the status of investigations and/or court proceedings
- Assist with justice-related forms and applications (such as the Crime Victim Assistance Program and Victim Impact Statements)
- Help victims prepare for testifying in court
- Accompaniment to court and justice-related meetings
